EDITORIAL For our Christmas soldiers

CHRISTMAS is here, for better or worse, and there's no more time to wish that it could be anything more than it is right now. The tree is trimmed, or it's not; the gifts were loved, or they were not; the family is getting along, or it's not. There's no more time for perfection. All we have now is time for reflection.

We hope you'll take a moment to reflect today on our soldiers, who are serving their country right now and who may not have the opportunity to

open gifts or gaze at a Christmas tree. Certainly they've been in the thoughts of many Americans year-round: Who doesn't know an elementary-school class sending cards and good wishes to a unit? We support our troops on bumper stickers and blogs; we send them our prayers, and the contents of our pocketbooks, on a regular basis (the Web site www.anysoldier.com, which links civilians who want to send care packages to active servicemen, says it has helped about 140,145 servicemen since 2003).

This speaks to our individual generosity and our understanding of the tremendous sacrifices these troops have made for us. Once a soldier joins the military, he forfeits the right to choose the battles he will fight in and the causes he will live or die for. That's why the most important gift we can offer our troops is careful deliberation of the battles we choose for them.

Kevin Tillman, who served as an Army Ranger with his brother Pat before the latter was killed in Afghanistan, wrote in these pages earlier this year that: "In a democracy, the policy of the leaders is the policy of the people." That was a rather eloquent way of stating
