Connecting with someone overseas is easy. There is a website that will even take the guess work out of what to send in a care package.

Here's the link: AnySoldier.com.

Troops sign up for this site and can post letters and pictures on-line. Many give suggestions for what they'd like in a care package and tell you a little about themselves and their circumstances in the far corners of the world.

The site let's you select the troops you correspond with by several criteria, including what branch of service they're in, what state their unit is from and their gender.

Several people in our area are already using this site to make life a little brighter for our hometown heroes overseas.

In the sidebar of this article, there's a video about a woman from Mt. Pleasant who's connected with 60 Camp Lejeune marines deployed to Iraq. Take a look and maybe you'll decide to be the next chapter in this happy holiday story.
